R. Gordon R. McNally was educated at the Royal High School in Edinburgh and at the University of Dundee, where he earned his graduate degree in dental surgery. He operated his own dental practice in Edinburgh until 2016. McNally was chair of the East of Scotland branch of the British Paedodontic Society and has held various academic positions. He has also served as a presbytery elder, chair of the Queensferry parish congregational board, and commissioner to the general assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Gordon joined Rotary in 1984 at age 26. A member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, he has served as president and vice president of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland. He has also served RI as a director and on several committees, most recently as an adviser to the 2022 Houston Convention Committee and chair of the Operations Review Committee.

Gordon says he looks forward to working with members to build new Rotary clubs and groups. "My vision is that Rotary should exist everywhere in a style to suit everyone who has the desire to be part of us and to help us do good in the world," he says.

He is a patron of the UK-based nonprofit Hope and Homes for Children and led a partnership between that organization and RIBI to support children in Rwanda who had been orphaned in the genocide there. He is a patron of Trade-Aid, an initiative of the Rotary Club of Grantham Kesteven, England, that provides sustainable humanitarian aid to individuals, families, and businesses in the developing world. He is also an ambassador for Bipolar UK, a national mental health organization. In August 2022, he was made a laureate of the Sino Phil Asia International Peace Awards Foundation.

In his free time, Gordon enjoys rugby, good food and wine, and stick dressing, the traditional Scottish craft of making walking sticks.

Gordon describes The Rotary Foundation as "the engine that provides the energy to do Rotary service." He and his spouse, Heather, also a Rotarian, are Paul Harris Fellows, Major Donors, Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation, and members of the Bequest Society.

Gordon wishes to dedicate his presidency to making the world a better place for his granddaughters, Ivy and Florence, and all the children of the world, to live and thrive.

TIGER: GUARD OF THE FOREST

Tiger (*Panthera tigris*), the national animal of our country. It represents the world's largest cat species. The weight is 600pounds and length is 10 feet. The black striped pattern on fiery-hud fur is unique to each one. They can swim well over long distances, they eat only meat. They can live up to 20 years in the wild and cubs remain with mothers until they reach almost two years old.

The tiger plays a crucial role in the health and diversity of the ecosystem. They are the apex predators in the ecosystem and are at the top of the food chain. The extinction of a top carnivore in an ecosystem can affect the relative abundance of herbivore species within an order. The extends of tiger through Asia bounded from Russia to Sumatra and Southeast Asia. It lives in grasslands, evergreen forest tropical rain forests and mangrove swamps. Tiger hunt weekly, usually at night. They prefer large mammals such as deer, sambar, gur etc.

Every year on 29th, July we observed International Tiger Day, to raise awareness for tiger conservation. It was effected in 2010 at Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit in Russia. To promote a global system for protecting the natural habitats of tigers and to raise public awareness for tiger conservation.

The National tiger census is done in every four years by the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) in partnership with state forest departments, NGOs and the wildlife institute of India (WII).The census uses a double sampling method based on ground based surveys and images from camera traps. According to the data released by the PM,the number of tigers in India increased by 200 in the past four years. In (2006-1,411)(2010-1706) (2014-2,226)(2018-2,967)(2022-3,167).It is a good sign for the ecosystem.

The tiger is the main centre of attraction for ecotourists. So it supports livelihood in the tourism sector. It preservation assures the survival of numerous species of flora and fauna as well as entire ecosystem. A tiger is a protector of the forest and sign of a healthy forest. Large forest which are nothing more than carbon sink in their natural state, are home to a thriving tiger population, which help in climate change. The more tiger we conserve the healthier our ecosystem will be and the large our national carbon sink will be.

Because of human interference into tiger habitats through industrialization, urbanization, poaching etc the national prey supply of the tiger has declined. As a result sometimes tiger take domestic livestock for prey. Removal of habitat due to increase in human civilization, cause tiger and human conflict.

Tiger Status in Odisha :-

Odisha is one of the most ecologically diverse regions in the country, home to several endangered and rare species. Among many species of animals and plants found in Odisha, the majestic Royal Bengal Tiger holds a significant place. The state over the years has played main role in conserving and reviving biodiversity. However, the decline in numbers of the big cats in Odisha has big concerns.

According to Wildlife Protection Society of India, there were 192 tigers in the state including 60 cubs in 2002. In 2018, the big cat population in Odisha had come down to 28, the same number that was reported in 2014. It proves that the tiger population is on the jeopardy in Odisha. Odisha is one of the first states to be part of 'Project Tiger' conservation programme launched in 1973. The project celebrates its 50th anniversary this month. Odisha has several dedicated protected areas for tiger conservation namely Similipal, Satkosia and Sunabeda covering a total area of approximately 5,300 square kilometres.

·Established in 1973, the Similipal Tiger Reserve is the largest of all the conservation areas, spanning over 2,750 square kilometers in Mayurbhanj district. It was one of the first nine tiger reserves in India and has also been added to UNESCO's biosphere reserves list. It is also the home of the extremely rare melanistic tiger.

·The Satkosia Tiger Reserve, located in Angul and Boudh districts is spread over 964 square kilometres. A local NGO Wild Orissa which has been monitoring the area reported that it has a rich flora and fauna diversity. It provide a good future for the tiger. But the ill equipped forest staff has been unable to control the continuous timber smuggling and poaching. There have been a number of armed attacks on the staff including the DFO in the last ten years. Wild Orissa strongly suggested that put this area under "Project Tiger" as this would capitulate excellent result in a short term.

On the other hand, the Sunabeda Wildlife Sanctuary, located in Nuapada district is spread over approximately 600 square kilometres and is home to a wide variety of species including leopards, sloth bears, hyenas, and bison apart from tigers. The Sunabeda Sanctuary was in the news recently when news of an elderly woman being killed and eaten by a Royal Bengal Tiger surfaced. However, later on it transpired that a leopard had killed the woman.

The primary reason for the decline in tiger numbers in Odisha is because of loss of habitat due to human encroachment, deforestation and infrastructure development. These factors have made it difficult for tigers to move freely and reproduce. Another major threat to tigers in Odisha is poachers. Tigers are often poached for their skin, bones and other body parts that are in high demand in illegal wildlife trade. Despite efforts to crackdown on poaching, it remains a major issue in many parts of Odisha. Climate change has emerged as another significant threat to tigers in Odisha. Rising temperatures, changing rainfall patterns and other climate-related factors are altering the natural habitat of tigers, making it difficult for them to adapt to changing conditions. At present there is no tiger in Satkosia. To increase tiger population in the reserve in 2018 interstate translocation project was introduced but it failed.

On the global Tiger day, it is crucial to have a well planned programme to save the tiger. Like the corridor connectivity with Similipal Tiger Reserve is crucial, the corridor connectivity with Anugul, Deogarh, Keonjhar, Karanjia forest Divisions are also important, need proper management with a focus on tiger monitoring. The other important corridors are Athgarh, Dhenanal, Anandapur (WL) and Baripada Forest Division, which ensure green flow from the Similipal Tiger Reserve. Recovery of identified corridor, intelligence based enforcement, anti poaching operations, regulations of tourism as per the guidelines issued by National Tiger conservation Authority strictly pursue places like Similipal, securing habitat for herbivores and coordination with the adjoining forest division within the state for keeping track on tigers.

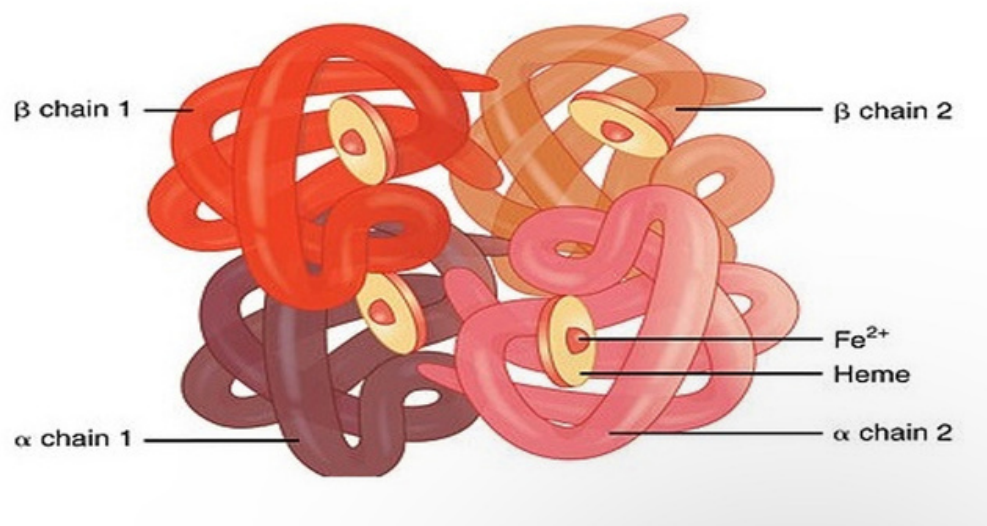

What is Thalassemia ?

Thalassemia is a haemoglobinopathy where normal amount of adult hemoglobin is not formed . It is a genetic disorder where the defect is transferred from either of the parents to the child .Parents do not suffer or manifest the symptoms & signs of the disease because they are trait or carrier . the inheritance pattern of thalassemia is autosomal recessive , hence for the child to become symptomatic both parents must be trait . This is possible when a male trait marries a female trait .

aHemoglobin has 2 parts – Haem & Globin.

Globin contains 4 polypeptide chains. Globin is responsible for formation of a normal hemoglobin molecule. Each globin chain contains 2 alpha and 2 beta moieties. Alpha chains have 141 amino acids, alpha gene present in chromosome 16. Beta chains have 146 amino acids, beta gene present in chromosome 11. From fetal life, structure globin polypeptide change from zeta, epsilon & gamma to alpha, delta & beta. Beta and alpha are the main chains found in adult hemoglobin. If beta gene is affected it's called beta thalassemia, if alpha gene is affected, it is called alpha thalassemia. Beta thalassemia is more prevalent in Odisha than alpha thalassemia. Depending on the amount of reduction & number of gene clusters affected the disease may be severe, intermediate or minor. Severe beta thalassemia is also called thalassemia major or transfusion dependent thalassemia. Intermediate thalassemia is called thalassemia intermedia or transfusion independent thalassemia. Thalassemia minor is also called thalassemia trait or carrier.

Diagrammatic representation of autosomal recessive inheritance.

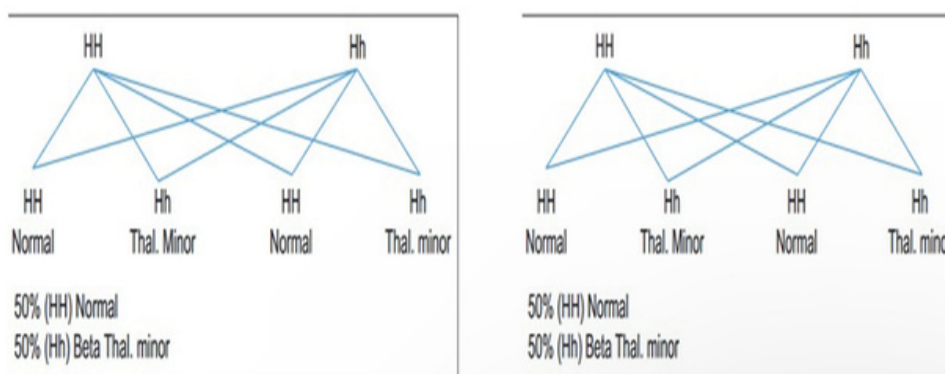


Figure: when 1 parent carrier(left), when both are carrier (right)

BURDEN OF THALASSEMIA

INDIA IS THE NEW THALASSEMIA CAPITAL OF THE WORLD.

Globally, 200 million people are affected, incidence nearly 4.4/10,000 live births. Countries most affected by this dreaded disease are Mediterranean countries, Africa, South East Asian countries where India is one of the worst affected. 10% of total world's incidence is contributed by India. Prevalence in India varies from 0.6 to 15% across different states. National figure for carriers of thalassemia remains at 5% to 7%. 1 in 8 thalassemia carriers live in India. Nearly 40 to 50 million carriers live in India. India constitutes a multi-ethnic, multi-cultural, multi-linguistic diverse population where around 10,000 to 12,000 thalassemia children are born annually. There are nearly 100,000 patients with a beta thalassemia syndrome and around 150,000 cases of sickle cell disease in India at one time. In the absence of National Registries of patients, the exact numbers are not known.

HOW IT IS AFFECTING NATION'S ECONOMY?

Out of 1 lakh beta thalassemia, 50% don't survive beyond 25 years. So the nation is losing an important group of citizens who are dying at the peak of their productive age who would have contributed highest to the nation's GDP. Each person with thalassemia spends around 1 lakh per year towards treatment. The nation spends around 15,000 crores for treatment of these patients. Blood transfusion burden is around 2 lakh units per month. 4 out of 10 thalassemia patients will be underemployed/unemployed because of disability-adjusted life years. Possess a huge social stigma causing heavy physical, psychosocial & financial burden to child & the family.

Only treatment available is palliative. Regular blood transfusion with/without iron chelation. Main cause for complication is iron overload. By this approach we are doing more harm to these children rather than causing any benefit. As if we are watering the plant, and simultaneously tearing the roots! This has prolonged the survival of these children, but it is far from ideal.

The only available cure for this disease is hematopoietic stem cell transplantation.(HSCT). But this is inaccessible to many , costly , tedious and there is a huge risk of failure .But as they say hope is the last thing ever lost , we still hope for a magical cure for this disease which would be accessible, affordable & simple .

Hence , PREVENTION IS THE ULTIMATE SOLUTION.

No other disease in medical science fulfills the proverb so appropriately that prevention is better than cure .

Risk factors for thalassemia : West Bengal and north eastern states are prevalent in HbE disease . 30 percent population suffer from HbE disease. In Odisha Sickle cell anemia prevalent in western belt , Thalassemia in southern & northern belt of Odisha .

Community most affected are Sindhis, Punjabis, Gujuratis, Bengalis, Mahars, Kolis, Saraswats, Lohanas, and Gaurs. There are around 3000 castes and 25,000 subcastes In India, people adhere to their specific caste .Tribes of Mayurbhanj more affected by thalassemia .

CONSANGUINEOUS MARRIAGE – one of the major risk factor .

3rd degree consanguinity is prevalent in Odisha .Consanguineous marriage remains the choice of an estimated 10.4% of the world population .

In south India, consanguineous marriages are culturally and Socially acceptable andConstitute 20%-50% of all marriages.one billion people live in countries where consanguinity is socially accepted , so almost 1 in 3 marriages occur between cousins where this marriage is a age old culture .

PREVENTION :

Test for thalassemia before getting married .

Awareness, screening and counselling – first step of prevention

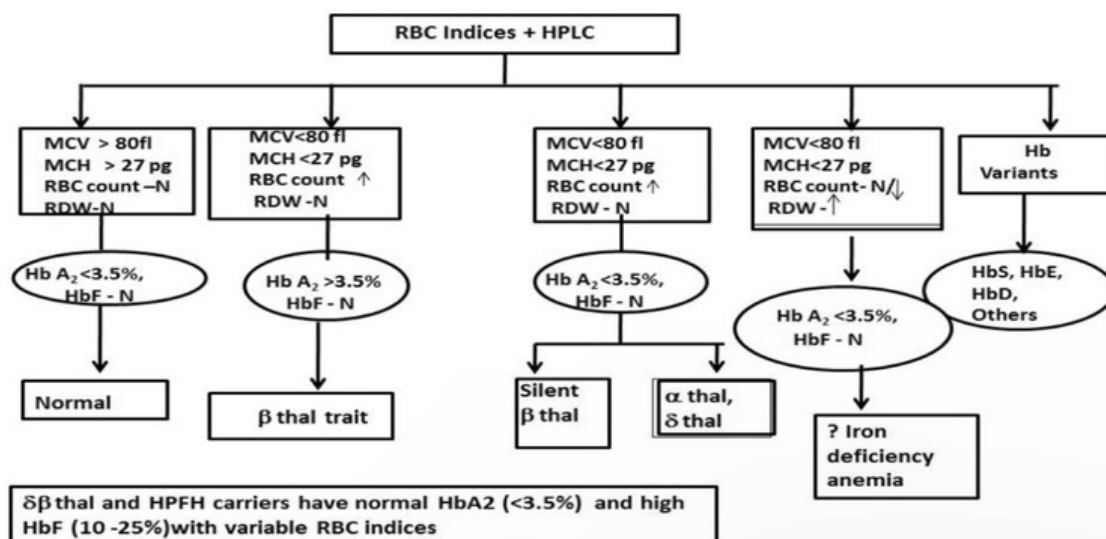

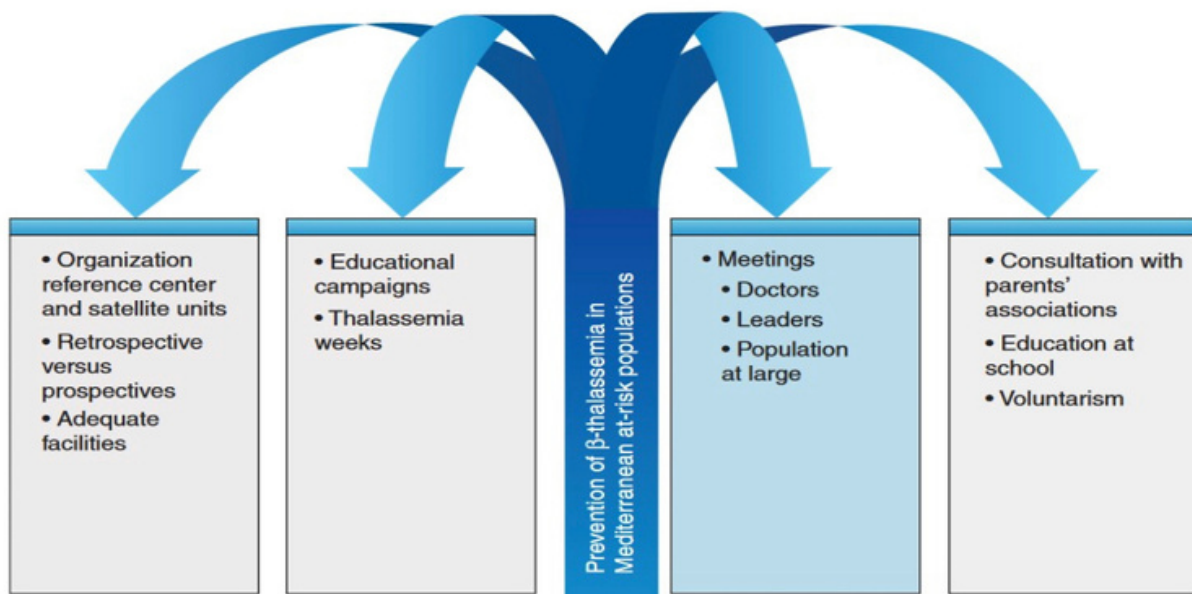


Figure 1. Strategy for prevention of β -thalassemias in Mediterranean at-risk populations.

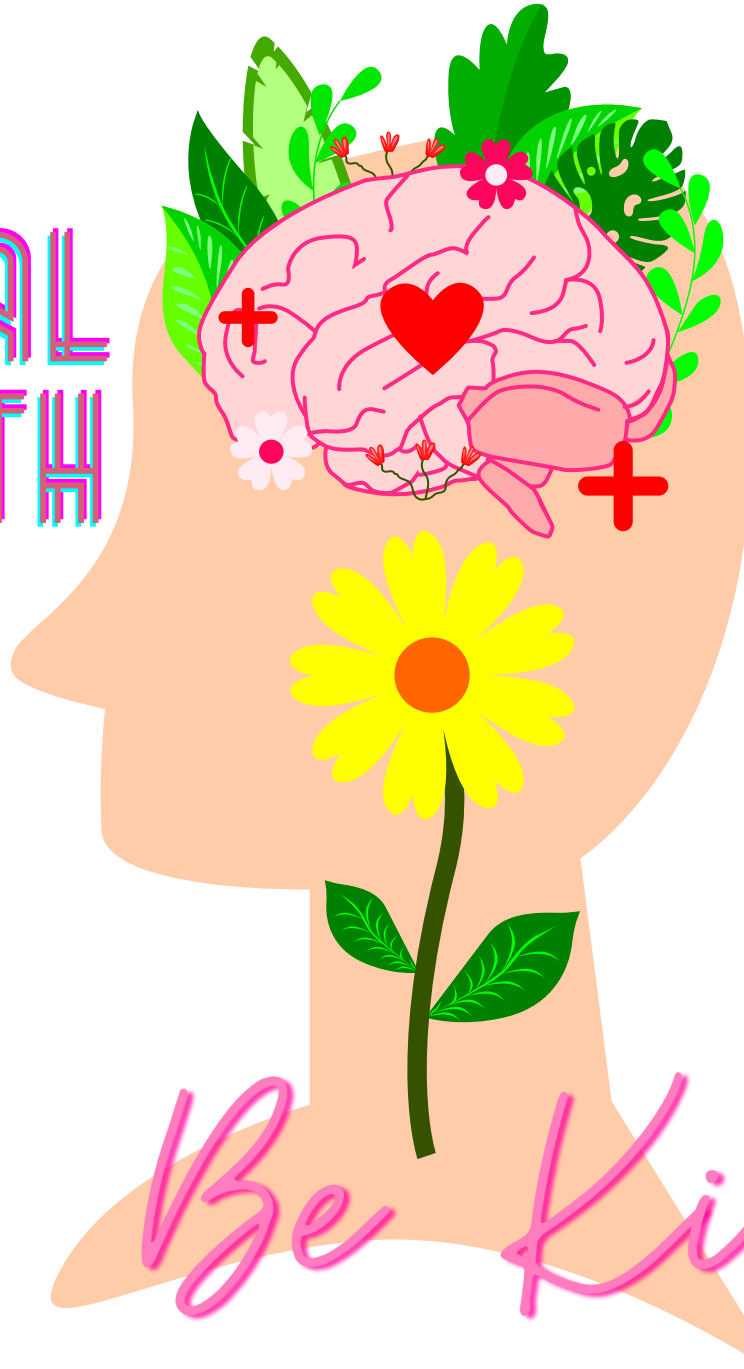
